Lighting the Advent Candle of Peace

[Two candles are lit: the candle of hope and the candle of peace]

We light the candle of peace which shines even more brightly in the darkness where hope might struggle.

What peace is this?

Let us hear what God the Lord will speak, for he will speak peace to his people, to those who turn to him in their hearts. When steadfast love and faithfulness meet, righteousness and peace will kiss each other.

Prayer of Reconciliation (based on Isaiah 40:1-11)

The promise of peace, when there is no peace; when fear scrambles our minds; when confusion knocks at the door; when unemployment threatens our homes; when old age stares back from the mirror; we listen for your voice, O God: "Comfort, comfort, O my people".

We are like the grass, our time is short. Peace is fleeting, empires come and empires go; history moves on.

Our good intentions are like flowers, beautiful to behold, then wither and fade.

Yet your Word, O God, will stand for ever.

The Word proclaims, "here is your God". He will care for his people, with love he offers hope: feeding our desire for right relationships, justice, and peace.

Mark 1:1-8 Marian Kingham

- ¹ The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God.
- ² As it is written in Isaiah the prophet:
- "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way.
- ³ A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."
- ⁴ John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. ⁶ John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. ⁸ I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the holy Spirit."

² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³ A voice of one calling:
"In the wilderness prepare
the way for the LORD;
make straight in the desert
a highway for our God.

⁴ Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain.

⁵ And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

⁶ A voice says, "Cry out." And I said, "What shall I cry?"

⁷ The grass withers and the flowers fall, because the breath of the LORD blows on them. Surely the people are grass.
